Brian had just gone to the local pawn store and bought me a used Nextbook. Joy loaded Kindle on it and I now had a simple way to read and it took very little space in my laptop bag on the plane. Now I can read whenever I want!

There are fun things too...helping with Kid's club at Easter time, traffic control during hay rides and helping with logistics of beach parties and counseling those who have made decisions to follow Christ. Helping with our potlucks and being part of ladies Bible study and our fun monthly Ladies luncheons. Always things going on here and we are thrilled to see close to 800 souls added to God's family this year alone. I am now going to church here in the park as it is easier and it is where all my friends are. We have a wonderful full time Chaplain.


My family continues to expand with four little ones this year,
